



New homes for the city

A new era of affordable housing began in Sunderland after major plans to build 170 new high-quality affordable homes were given the go-ahead by Sunderland City Council. The new homes form part of our planned £172 million investment into new affordable and desirable housing in the city, with more than 720 people set to move into the homes once they're complete.

Building the homes across six sites on Wearside will also help to kick-start economic and social recovery in the city following the pandemic, with **279 jobs**, expected to be created as a result.

Councillor Graeme Miller, Leader of Sunderland City Council said:

"High quality housing for everyone in Sunderland is an absolute priority for this City Council. As a council we work closely with all developers and are supportive of Gentoo's plans and its contribution to making Sunderland more dynamic, healthy and vibrant."



River Quarter

We believe everyone has the right to feel safe in their home and River Quarter, an apartment block located in the city centre, has recently undergone major modernisation works to bring it in line with current Government fire safety legislation.

In partnership with EQUANS, we installed lifesaving sprinklers in each property and within the car park, replaced cladding throughout the building, fitted fire rated composite doors and we upgraded the buildings smoke detection and fire alarm system. These vital improvements protect our tenants and ensures their long-term safety in their homes.



Gentoo Homes

Our profit for purpose HBF five-star private housebuilding arm, Gentoo Homes, generates a surplus to support the delivery of affordable rented homes across the city. Despite the housebuilding industry being halted by the national lockdown, a major £2.2 million was reinvested into the Group last year helping to support Gentoo's Affordable Homes Plan to create new affordable homes in Sunderland.

As a result, Gentoo Homes enjoyed a successful year of sales, with the industry experiencing one of its strangest twelve months for a number of years.



Empower Sunderland Community Fund

Gentoo is contracted by Empower Community Solar to manage more than 5,000 solar panel systems in Sunderland. In 2020-21, profit share from the portfolio generated income of £90,221, all of which was reinvested back into the Group's housing services.

Other shared profit from the solar panel scheme is allocated to Empower Sunderland Community Fund - which is run independent of Gentoo. The pandemic led to a surge in demand for the services of the voluntary sector, and to ensure these voluntary and community groups were supported, Empower funding was donated to community and voluntary groups that were delivering frontline services to the city's residents.

30 organisations in Wearside received donations totalling over £104,000, using £87,000 of grant funding from Empower Sunderland and an additional £17,000 donations from Gentoo's Tenant and Community Voice Forum budgets. The funding was granted to organisations to continue with key volunteering services ranging from delivering hot meals to shielding tenants to supporting the victims of domestic abuse.



"It was a huge relief to receive this funding into our sixth week of delivering hot food and engaging with the tenants of the care schemes. We engaged with more than 100 tenants on a weekly basis and this funding helped us to carry on helping to reduce social isolation in all of the schemes we visited."



Our Young Persons' Team offers a range of vocational, educational and housing-related services to equip young adults aged 16-25 with the skills, experience and confidence to become independent and maintain a home.

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Wellbeing service

Our Wellbeing service supports tenants to live independently in their home through aids and adaptations. Gentoo also manages six sheltered and two extra-care schemes across the city for those who chose to move into a residential building, or those with care needs.

During the pandemic, the essential government guidance on social distancing resulted in many tenants and residents being confined to their homes alone and unable to see friends and family. To combat this social isolation, our Wellbeing service hosted COVID secure social activities and events including singers, arts and crafts, bingo, and guizzes.

The eight sheltered schemes were also supported by various local community and voluntary groups who donated activity packs, afternoon tea's, Easter packages and so much more.



Financial inclusion

Working in partnership with Aviva, we provide a low-cost, weekly home contents insurance scheme for tenants. During 2020-21, **6,337** tenants benefitted from this scheme.

Employment and skills

Our Wise Steps programme continues to provide one-to-one specialist support to help tenants take positive steps towards securing employment. Partnering with other organisations, tenants can access a range of employment and training opportunities to remove barriers to work. Through our ongoing Affordable Homes Programme we're also able to support work experience on our developments. Working with our partners EQUANS, Tolent and Sunderland College, we've supported students to get their first steps on the construction ladder by completing placements on the sites alongside their studying.

Apprenticeships

Since being formed in 2001, we have created **277 apprenticeship opportunities**, with **90%** of recruits successfully completing their apprenticeship with us.

The uncertainty of the pandemic last year meant we were unable to offer apprenticeship roles in the business. We remained dedicated to our people and continued to work with our existing apprentices, with eight people

completing their apprenticeships in 2020-21 and gaining permanent employment with Gentoo.

Investing in our people

We believe that our strength comes from the dedication, passion, skills and energy of our colleagues and volunteers and we are committed to their development and growth.

In 2019-20 we invested **£601,078** on upskilling our colleagues (approximately £583 per colleague) and an additional **£347,890** on wellbeing initiatives (approximately £334 per colleague).

Brenda named TPAS Tenant of the Year

We hugely value the commitment of our engaged tenants and residents, and we are dedicated to ensuring their contribution and knowledge is celebrated across the business. We are delighted that Brenda, an inspirational tenant who became a domestic abuse champion in her local community, was crowned 'Tenant of the Year' at the National TPAS Awards. This major accolade was awarded to Brenda for her active role in the community, including her role as Chair of our Washington Tenant Voice Panel. Since winning the award, Brenda has joined our Board of Directors to ensure the voice of tenants is at the forefront of Gentoo's decision making.

My Gentoo

Our online self-service portal, My Gentoo, has struck success with tenants with the number of tenants registered for the service more than doubling over the past year. The successful launch of our online repairs service which allows users to report, amend and cancel routine repairs to their home has seen thousands of tenants using the service daily from home and on the go.

Putting the voice of our tenants at the heart of Gentoo

Our tenants' voice is at the heart of everything we do, and we want to ensure their voices are heard and they have the opportunity to influence and shape the services we deliver for them.

We've transformed our approach to tenant engagement and introduced our new, dedicated Tenant Voice Team, who are proactive in how we listen, learn and put issues right for our tenants. The team has been put in place to deal directly with complaints, work with our tenant groups and liaise with community and voluntary organisations.

We actively work with 69 tenants across various groups and forums such as our Tenant and Community Voice Forums and Ustoo.
While we were unable to meet with tenants and residents in person during the pandemic, we hosted online consultations, arranged phone calls and created WhatsApp groups to make sure our tenants still had a say in decisions being made within the Group.

The social value generated from this was £444,692

Top governance rating

We were awarded G1 governance rating by the Regulator of Social Housing (RSH) in recognition of the way we have transformed the organisation by making huge improvements and positive change across the business.

We have changed our culture, structure and strengthened our governance controls to provide reassurance that previous issues and concerns could not, and will not, happen again. The recognition is testament to Gentoo colleagues and tenants who have worked tirelessly to refocus the business on our core social purpose of servicing our tenants in Sunderland.

Partnering with the police We work closely with Northumbria Police to tackle issues such as anti-social and criminal behaviour in our neighbourhoods and during the COVID-19 pandemic we supported Northumbria Police to enforce emergency coronavirus laws.

As part of the partnership, our Neighbourhood Enforcement Officers investigated all reports of Gentoo tenants breaking social distancing guidelines and worked with the police to investigate reported households and deter any further breaches.

The aim was to protect other residents who were at risk and help to reduce the spread of the virus by ensuring social distancing was adhered to.



Domestic Abuse Housing Alliance (DAHA)

We're a proud co-founder of the Domestic Abuse Housing Alliance (DAHA) and this year we donated £21,500 to support the organisation. We play a key role within DAHA's work, including providing domestic abuse training to other housing association.

This year, our partners EQUANS and Tolent donated £12,000 to DAHA to help fund their work with individuals and businesses to educate and help victims.



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Foundation of Light

We're an official community partner of Sunderland AFC (SAFC) and Foundation of Light (FoL), a registered charity of the football club.

The FoL delivered a number of activities and employability courses to help our tenants build skills for employment such as self-esteem, and literacy and numeracy and supported one person into part time

Positive Footprints

Our work with Positive Footprints changes the lives of children and young people by delivering personal development programmes in local schools that allow self-discovery, raise aspirations, and open the world of work.

The closure of schools and phased reopening due to COVID-19 impacted the ability to deliver as intended, but three local schools completed the programme using technology to stay

This created a social value of £12,432

connected. The programme is potentially life changing and the benefit to young people can be seen for years to come.

Working with contractors

We work closely with our principal contractors to help fulfil our social purpose in our communities. Our contractors commit to supporting the delivery of social value initiatives.

Throughout 2020-21 we worked closely with four contractor partners, Engie, Tolent, Kier and Bell Group.

From working with local community organisations and schools to supporting our Give it a Grow gardening competition, our contractors have worked across the city to provide unique and

exciting opportunities for our tenants and Sunderland's residents.

More than £20,000 was donated by Tolent to local schools, and colleges in Houghton-le-Spring to fund new laptops to support at-home learning, fund breakfast clubs and provide Christmas toys to local families.

These created a social value of £294,653.55

Providing homes for those in need

Everyone deserves the right to live in a safe and secure home. We work with Sunderland City Council and charity, Changing Lives, to provide homes for people sleeping rough in the city. This work was amplified and extremely important during the pandemic with the Government's aim to keep people off the street.

During 2020-21, we helped to provide a home for four adults who had no permanent home and were sleeping rough. We also provided secure housing for 45 adults and families who were living in temporary accommodation.

This partnership work helped to generate a social value of £762,487

Through innovative property investment schemes such as Core 364 and the inclusion of carbon reduction and environmentally efficient technology in our new build developments, we're working to create homes that are fit for the future.

Gardening is known to be beneficial to mental health and during the COVID-19 restrictions more people took to their gardens to unwind.

Our annual gardening competition returned 25 tenants entered the competition last year, for the fifth year to recognise and celebrate the efforts of green-fingered tenants. 25 tenants entered the competition last year, and in partnership with EQUANS, five tenants were recognised for their fantastic gardens.

This created a social value of £29,629





Easter egg appeal

Each year we run an Easter campaign to collect donations from our staff and our contractors to provide our most vulnerable tenants and residents across the city with Easter eggs and chocolate. We received the largest donation of eggs ever which were distributed to several local charities and voluntary and community groups including Sunderland Foodbank and a range of homelessness services operating in the city.

Fundraising for our corporate charities

Despite living and working under COVID-19 restrictions for most of the year, our colleagues rallied together to raise much needed funds for both Action on Dementia Sunderland and St Benedict's Hospice. £17,000 was raised across the year through fundraising activities including raffles, bonus balls and a regular payroll deduction scheme. These charities play a vital role in the local community and we are proud to be supporting them through both resources and fundraising again in 2021.

Recognising the contribution of our colleagues

As one of the largest employers in Sunderland we're proud of the people we employ and the difference our employees make to the lives of our tenants every day.

Our 'You Are Gentoo' scheme continues to acknowledge and celebrate the brilliant work delivered by our colleagues each and every day.

We celebrated the achievement of **45** colleagues who were given awards from mor than **400** nominations in our two awards last year.

All Gentoo colleagues are paid the Living Wage and we continue to be an accredited Living Wage Employer.

Investing in our colleagues is hugely important to us and we're proud to hold a Gold standard Investors in People accreditation.
